Rooted in Regional Feminist Declarations, the 2024 Agenda will include strategic sessions on FUNDING, RESEARCH and ADVOCACY, analyzing the gaps, needs and opportunities for each of these three crucial areas and mapping the way forward to bring meaningful change.

2024 PRIORITIES

This year, we are establishing **regional collectives** to develop **Regional Feminist Declarations** for gender equality in and through education led by CSOs, experts and researchers.

The Declarations will be a central, evidence-based call to action to public and private funders, the UN system and education actors and will outline joint actions and commitments to be taken forward by the regional collective.



The agenda will be rooted in four Regional Feminist Declarations, developed by Network members following consultations which took place earlier this year. Through the agenda, which will include sessions on research and evidence as well as funding for gender-transformative education, we will develop a deeper understanding of and pathway towards achieving gender equality in and through education.

The outcome for this year's convening is a new report - The World We Want: Four Regional Declarations for GTE. This is supported by advocacy plans to ensure that we can build momentum beyond the convening, in particular looking at key moments at national, regional and global level where we can collectively drive forward this agenda.
